GoodSearch



The ROARING GAME

The Albany and Utica Curlers Improving fine weather and splendid ice – The score Up to Noon.

The Albany Curling Club reached Utica last evening, being received at the depot by J. C. P. Kincaid and others of the home club. The visitors were quarter at the Butterfield House. This forenoon they proceeded to the rink in the gulf, finding the ice in capital condition. Play began about eleven o'clock and at 12:15 there was an intermission for lunch. Their score at that time stood as follows:

The cosy quarters of the Utica club were fitter, furnished and occupied this noon as never before. The furniture comprised meats, chicken, sandwiches, coffee, celery, pie et cetera, and the home as well as the visiting curlers and their friends were generously feasted. The spread was furnished by Isaac Whiffen and Edwin Peckham, and after the repast the Albanians and the rest united in a hearty vote of thanks to the thoughtful entertainers. While the lunch was in progress, Mr. Kincaid called attention to the picture brought by the Albany Club and presented to the Utica curlers. The sketch is an illustration of "The Break-Up last spring." The Albany men are supposed to be making "ringers" at a railroad rate of speed, when suddenly, the ice gives way. On curler clasps his favor-

ite piece of granite and goes down. Another clings to his broom as a drowning man would clutch at a straw, and the rest are comically trying to "skip" from the rotten ice. The picture has been placed on the walls of the Utica club room and will be duly cherished.

Play was resumed shortly before one o'clock. The umpire is James G. French. The scorers are John Peattie and J. c. P. Kincaid. The close of the contest promises to be interesting. The last match between the clubs resulted in a tie. Although the Albanians have a lead of 8, the complexion is able to be changed. The Utics on rink No. 2 have been very unfortunate, Fred Allen barely getting in a 2 at the eleventh hour, making a grand total of 3. The Albany curlers, jolly men, every one, express themselves as delighted with their entertainment in Utica.


