We are now in the busiest part of our curling season, with what seems like a bonspiel every weekend in addition to regular league play. I hope you are all having a fun and fulfilling season. I'm especially impressed by the involvement of our new members, who are participating in our leagues, getting involved in our in-house bonspiels and forming 5-and-under teams to travel to their first out-of-town bonspiels.

### Curling on the Tube

Can't get enough curling? We are entering the time of the season that is rich in quality curling webstreams with good commentary. This is a great way to enjoy good curling and learn more about the strategic aspects of the game. If you have a computer, tablet, phone, or a streaming device on your TV (e.g., Roku, Chromecast), there are many opportunities to watch top-level curling with good commentary. Perhaps the best are the TSN feeds of the Continental Cup, Canadian Juniors, Scotties Tournament of Hearts (women's Canadian championship), and Brier (men's Canadian championship) that can be viewed with the WatchESPN app or on the web via [www.espn.com/watch](http://www.espn.com/watch). Anyone with a cable subscription to ESPN can watch these feeds on the ESPN3 channel. Games are archived for about a month and can be watched later if you miss the live action. You can watch Saskatchewan provincial qualification play (men's and women's) on the CurlSask YouTube channel. NBCSN and the Olympic Channel will broadcast selected games from the wom-

en's and men's world championships in March and April, respectively. Check to see if your cable TV subscription includes these channels. And of course, throughout the season, selected European and world events are webstreamed through World Curling TV and World Curling Tour TV (WCT TV) on YouTube. Some of these webstreams may be geo-blocked in the U.S. if domestic broadcast TV has distribution rights. Of course, you can also watch local curling at the Utica Curling Club, including archived games, on our own YouTube channel, <https://www.youtube.com/user/uticacurling>. We have an extensive archive of bonspiel and league championships with commentary.

### **Rose Bonspiel**

The Rose Bonspiel is the club's closing event of the season Thursday-Saturday March 21-23, including a season-ending bash on Saturday night. It's not too early to be thinking about forming a team to play in this event. Even if you are not playing, please consider joining us for the closing party on Saturday evening, and celebrating another great curling season. You can help us toast the ice plant for its dedicated service, join in some hilarious "short game" action in your formal duds, or enjoy skating on our ice as it begins to melt away. Don't miss it!
