

## THE GLENGARRY CHALLENGE

The Glengarry Challenge was the second trophy to be given to the Utica Glengarries in 1950 by Marjorie Foster our first President. A silver vase went to the winning team and each member of the team received a pin in the shape of a Glengarry hat. For many years the format was played by having a team sign up to challenge the previous winner. The challenge went on all during the season. The winner of the trophy was the team with the most wins during the season. This was actively competed for until the '80s when it became more difficult to find the time to compete for the trophy,

The trophy became a daytime competition for a number of years and for a short time it was a mixed event.

In 2003, the pin and the vase were reactivated. A tea pot and base were also given with winners engraved on the base. The winner of the trophy was declared the women's Club Champion. Winner of this event and the recipient of the tea pot were: Cindy Brown, skip; Kathy Palazzoli, 3rd; Cindy Ciaralli, 2nd; Barb Felice, lead. The antique tea pot is believed to be about 100 years old. The tea pot was donated by Peggy Rotton and the base was crafted by Mr. Burnett, Mary Ellen Sofinski's father-in-law. The Trophy is now valued at between \$2500 - \$3000.

### RULES

Beginning February 2003 a women's club championship will be held annually, to play for the **Glengarry Trophy pin**. Competition will be 8 ends, bonspiel format; round robin up to 6 teams, over 6 teams will be knock out. Teams will be self-selected. Dates will be determined by Schedule Committee. The Chair may compete in event. The fee will be determined by Committee. The winner of this competition will be the Glengarry Club Champion. This will be a club event and all Glengarries will be eligible to compete.
